With the approval of the **2030 Agenda Regional Strategy for Sustainable Development**, the Emilia-Romagna Region has adopted the **17 objectives** of the United Nations Agenda, to outline a project for the future of Emilia-Romagna based on sustainability. A project aimed primarily at generating **quality jobs**, countering **social, economic, generational, gender** and **territorial inequalities**, accompanying Emilia-Romagna in the **ecological transition**, which is the test bench of this generation and the challenge of our time.

The conference, thanks to the contribution of authoritative experts, intends to promote a comparison aimed at strengthening and building networks of relations between territories and share a public reflection with local actors that contributes to building an integrated and multilevel system of Agendas and Strategies for Sustainable Development, from the one of States and Regions to the one of the smallest and most peripheral Municipality.

EMILIA-ROMAGNA'S STRATEGY AGENDA 2030 FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

The foundation of the Strategy is the Region's engagement in the **Pact for Work and Climate** and, starting from the specificities of our territory, with the support of the Italian Alliance for Sustainable Development (ASVIS), the Strategy identifies about 100 quantitative targets to be achieved by 2025 and 2030, to be monitored every year in order to assess Emilia-Romagna's position with respect to global challenges, measure the contribution of regional policies and, if necessary, redirect them.
